"Afghanistan: Trapped in Taliban's Brutality, A Product of USA-Pakistan Support"

Undoubtedly, the Taliban, acting as a savage, non-civilized, fundamentalist, and fascist group, have turned Afghanistan into a 'hostage prison.' Serving as proxies for the ISI intelligence network, Pakistan, and the USA, they work against the interests of the Afghan people. Their daily activities perpetuate their nature as male-dominated religious extremists, installed by the USA, leading to social contradictions, cultural annihilation, and the eradication of the Farsi-Dari language, a key connective element for the nation for centuries.

Throughout their two-year reign, the Taliban systematically suppressed political activists under various pretexts. Their oppressive tactics mirror those employed by capitalist occupying forces in countries they control. *The Taliban's fundamentalist and fascist sovereignty deploys numerous proxies to identify political activists, resulting in mysterious and brutal murders, torture, psychological pressure, beatings, insults, and humiliation within Taliban prisons.*

For over two years, the Taliban, supported directly by the USA, have oppressed opposition forces, imprisoned previous regime employees, and accused political opposition of ties to imperialist governments, conveniently ignoring their own installation into power through a conspiracy by the USA.

The Taliban's suppression of political activists in Afghanistan, backed by direct US support, has transformed the nation into a 'hostage prison.' Their oppressive actions extend across various social realms, reflecting their male-dominated religious extremism.

Publicly and covertly, the Taliban rulers have acted as oppressors of political activists, using violence and threats to address social conflicts within a reactionary capitalist framework. Their suppression mechanism involves hiring

individuals to identify political activists, leading to daily mysterious killings and brutal torture of prisoners. The Taliban accuses people of various pretexts, insulting Islam and alleging connections or dependence on imperialist governments, conveniently ignoring their own status as foreign proxies installed into power by the USA.

Despite claims that political activists can return to Afghanistan, the reality is different, especially for non-Pashtun people who, upon their return, face danger and even death. The Taliban's oppressive rule targets political activists, including former technocrats from past regimes and civil activists, creating traps for them. Some political groups spend substantial amounts abroad, attempting to negotiate with the Taliban for a share of political power. These groups are often funded by rich foreign countries pursuing specific projects.

The Taliban's rule, spanning over two years, indicates that any political activist objecting to their oppression faces suppression. Despite claims that activists can return, the Taliban's actions show that those who object to the Taliban's oppression, the subjugation of nationalities, poverty, and the integration of religion and government are met with repression. Political and civil technocratic groups sent from western nations have faced the brunt of the Taliban's fundamentalist and fascist rule.

When the Taliban's fundamentalist and fascist rule claims that political activists can return to Afghanistan, it specifically addresses individuals and groups who have no qualms about the Taliban's nature. Their desires are limited to sharing political power or engaging in projects funded by imperialist governments and institutions, making them dependent on foreign services. However, the functioning of the Taliban's rule over the past two years reveals that any political activist objecting to their oppression, the subjugation of nationalities, poverty, hunger, and the integration of religion and government, faces suppression. This repression is especially evident against political and civil technocratic groups sent from Western nations.

The UN and Human Rights commissions, influenced by the contradictions of world powers like China, Russia, and the USA, demonstrate dual criteria in dealing with fundamentalist groups. Some support these groups, using them as proxies or labelling them as terrorists, even providing bribes for the release of political activists. This indicates that current global norms, such as human rights and women's rights, have lost their neutrality, with governments and organizations aligning them with their goals within the capitalist system.

In such a context, the only recourse is the unity of the people and the struggle for the release of political prisoners in Afghanistan against the fundamentalist and fascist sovereignty of the Taliban and their repressive machine. The people must

amplify the voices of these political prisoners worldwide, preventing the Taliban's rule from coercing society into submission and resolving social conflicts through violence and cruelty.

We demand the immediate release of political prisoners without any conditions.

In a world marred by noncompliance with international law and the persistence of forceful violence leading to the eradication of nations, the term "genocide" and "crime against humanity" becomes more relevant than ever. Over the last century, numerous nations have fallen victim to aggression and devastation, often driven by false scenarios, preconceived notions, and geopolitical power struggles, such as the possession of nuclear weapons. It is crucial to envision a world where safety prevails for all of humanity.

Major technological powers like the USA, China, and Russia, with their significant global influence, should redirect their efforts from creating geopolitical hotbeds to collaborating for the welfare of the world population. The current situation, where nations inadvertently set traps for each other, only exacerbates global tensions. (1)

Unfortunately, the United Nations (UN), once the beacon for maintaining global peace, seems to have lost its authority in the face of escalating conflicts. The parallels with the League of Nations before World War II are unnerving. The UN's inability to prevent global conflicts ultimately led to the cataclysmic events

of the Second World War. The fear now looms that the UN lacks the authority to ensure peace in the contemporary world.

The interconnected issues in Ukraine, Palestine, and Afghanistan are symptomatic of the strategic rivalries among major powers, creating a precarious global environment. To address these challenges, it is imperative to consider cooperative security measures rather than perpetuating geopolitical rivalries. This article delves into the urgent need for a paradigm shift in global governance, emphasizing cooperation and collective responsibility to ensure a safer world for present and future generations

Terms Used, Narratives Shifted: Politico-Strategic Goals Unveiled'

While I acknowledge that individuals with a superiority complex often engage in continuous deception and exaggeration, causing annoyance to others, the real concern arises when such individuals assume positions of power. Their hidden ambitions and self-centred sentiments, rooted in false narratives or delusions of mental, physical, ethnic, racial, or religious supremacy, transform them into dangerous wild animals and typical beasts.

History bears witness to numerous examples globally. Figures like Adolf Hitler, Churchill, Netanyahu, Stalin, Pol Pot (the Cambodian dictator), Harry Truman who used the atomic bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The uranium bomb detonated over Hiroshima on 6 August 1945 had an explosive yield equal to 15,000 tonnes of TNT. It raised and burnt about 70 percent of all buildings and cost an estimated 140000 death by the end of 1945, along with increased rate of cancer and chronic disease among the survivors. (2) *According to the Euro-Med Human Rights Monitor, Israel has dropped more than 25,000 tonnes of explosives on the Gaza Strip since October 7,2023 equivalent to two nuclear bombs.* (3)

In Afghanistan notorious criminals such as Abdul Rahman Khan, Hashim Khan (the butcher), Nadir Khan (the traitor), Hafiz Ullah Amin (the killer), and Gulbuddin Hekmatyar (Kabul city slaughter, who launched hundred rockets for a month on civilians in Kabul killed and injured around 100,000 people) demonstrating how a distorted sense of superiority led to the annihilation of thousands.

Recent events in Gaza, where thousands, including children, women, and the elderly, fell victim to the overwhelming air force aimed at eradicating Palestine from the Middle East map, underscore the need to analyse such crimes comprehensively. Understanding why and how such crimes recurrently occur globally requires a multifaceted examination. The 1998 Rome Statute establishing the International Criminal Court (Rome Statute) is the document that

reflects the latest consensus among the international community on this matter. It is also the treaty that offers the most extensive list of specific acts that may constitute the crime.

In view of the Rome Statute of International Criminal Court, Israel prime minister Mr Netanyahu has committed “ crime against humanity, “ which means any of the acts when committed as part of widespread or systematic attack directed against any civilian population, with the acknowledgement of the attack; involving *murder, extermination, deportation or forceable transfer of Population, imprisonment or deprivation of physical liberty in violation of fundamental rules of international law, Torture; Rape, sexual slavery, enforced prostitution etc. or other grounds that are universally recognized as impermissible under international law, in connection with any act referred to in this paragraph or any crime within the jurisdiction of the Court.*(4)”

“Israel’s culture of deceit always seeks to blame Palestinians for the atrocities it carries out against the civilian population the recent bombing of the hospitals in Gaza. (3)” World public protest organised around the world against the recent killings, bombings and barbaric action of Israel against the Palestinians demonstrate anger and hatred of genocide about the bombing of hospitals in Gaza. “Called by more than 100 social organizations, thousands marched in Mexico City on Sunday to demand a stop to what they described as a genocide against the Palestinian population and an end to Israel's attacks.” (5) “*In protests around the world, in the corridors of the United Nations and in the angry chambers of social media, one word is getting louder and louder: genocide.* The Jewish state is doing in its ravaging of the Gaza Strip, which is home to some 2.3 million Palestinians. Over the weekend, demonstrators slathered a White House gate in red paint, in a message to the Biden administration about the perceived blood on its hands for its staunch support of Israel. In condemning Israel’s actions, governments in Brazil, South Africa, and Columbia among others, have all explicitly invoked “genocide” to explain their outrage.” (6) The criminal criminal actions of Israel against the Palestinians the US unsparing support of Israelis isolating the US in the world public views more than ever before.(7)”

The Israeli military has rounded up hundreds of Palestinians across the northern Gaza Strip, separating families and forcing men to strip to their underwear before trucking some to an undisclosed location

Israel’s overwhelming campaign against Hamas has led to the widespread devastation of besieged Gaza, triggering a humanitarian crisis. Israeli bombardments have now killed more than 10,000 Palestinians in Gaza, according to health officials, more than one-third of whom are children. The living finds

themselves trapped in a nightmare of debris and mounting disease, with electricity, water, and food scarce. A real genocide and crime against humanity.

From my perspective, two factors contribute to this understanding. First, the definition of terminology shapes the narrative to achieve specific goals. Politicians, statesmen, and military authorities often use terms like "terrorists" and "freedom fighters" interchangeably based on their convenience. For instance, the Taliban was initially labelled a terrorist group, but the U.S. administration now engages with them as Saviors of Afghanistan. Similarly, Hamas was once a close ally of Israel but is now labelled a terror group. A closer look reveals that Hamas is a freedom fighter, staunchly opposing the cruel occupation of Palestine imposed by Israel Zionist and fascist regimes for 75 years, with full support from the USA.

The Taliban's assistance in seizing power over the past 20 years during the American occupation of Afghanistan, initially framed as a battle against a terrorist group, has evolved to describe them as guardians. The original agenda, aimed at striking Iran and annihilating it, is now outdated as the polarity of the world has shifted. Asian powers like India, China, Russia, and Iran stand united against U.S. dominance, forming a robust defence.

The emerging regional powers of China, Russia, and Iran will not permit aggressive pre-emptive attacks by the U.S. administration, like those witnessed in Iraq, resulting in the killing, devastation, and suffering of millions – a crime against humanity. Consequently, the USA will not be allowed to continue its decades-long actions on Earth.
